# **Theatre in Schools Scotland** Summary of pilot Year One

"The best thing about Theatre in Schools has been to be able to bring such high quality, stimulating theatre to our pupils who live in an area of high disadvantage and to make them appreciate and value their experiences. Theatre in Schools Scotland (TiSS) has been developed by Imaginate and the National Theatre of Scotland, in partnership with leading performing arts companies/organisations for children and young people; Catherine Wheels Theatre Company, Visible Fictions and Starcatchers.

Theatre in Schools Scotland is a new initiative, to support and develop the provision of theatre in Scotland's schools, with the long-term aim of ensuring that every child in Scotland receives – at their nursery or school – a minimum of one performing arts production, per year, as a core part of their education.

The initiative has been created initially as a 3-year pilot project exploring the different models for touring theatre into schools.

Year 1 of Theatre in Schools Scotland has been supported by the Scottish Salmon Company and Arts and Business Scotland. "I feel strongly that children need to experience live theatre. ### **Aims of Theatre in Schools Scotland**

- > Reach every local authority in Scotland
- > Raise the profile of the importance of children's work in schools in Scotland
- > Raise the value of quality children's work in schools in Scotland
- > Test and develop income models with local authorities, funders and schools
- Determine the infrastructure required to build capacity and continue Theatre in Schools Scotland following the end of the pilot
- Build support from regional theatres/venues and touring networks to ensure TiSS will build audience interest in theatre across Scotland



Catherine Wheels Theatre Company presents *Martha* – an original story about friendship written by Andy Manley, Gill Robertson and Annie Wood. Directed by Gill Robertson.

- 89.5% of responding teachers rated the show as 5 stars (excellent) with the remaining 10.5% rating the show at 4 stars
- 79% of responding teachers noticed their class was fully engaged with the show, 17% mostly engaged and 1 teacher opted for 'other' while stating 'A super experience for my children...thank you!'

Who is Martha? Martha lives by the sea... Martha lives alone... Martha doesn't need anyone...

She is stubborn, eccentric and highly independent.

Who are Martha's friends?

Not her next-door neighbour. Not her helpful postman. Not her secret admirer from across the bay.

# SHOPPING FOR SHOES

- 70% of responding teachers rated the show 5 stars (excellent) with 13.3% rating the show 4 stars
- 40% of responding teachers noticed their class was fully engaged with the show. 40% mostly engaged and 20% engaged in the show

Siobhan McClusky is 13 and passionately politically aware. Shaun Holmes is also 13 but is passionate about only one thing – shoes. A small part of Siobhan's heart belongs to Shaun even though he'd have difficulty putting a name to her face. Undeterred, and with a little bit of planning and nifty footwork, Siobhan soon helps Shaun discover that a pair of shoes can do much more than just help a person express themselves.

# The Model

#### The selection process

The productions to date have been chosen through a rigorous selection process. A number of shows from Scottish companies who have a proven track record of touring high quality shows into schools were considered by a panel of representatives from each of the partners. Productions also needed to fulfil a number of additional criteria such as targeting specific age groups, being tour-ready and having previously received critical acclaim. In 2017 we plan to put a call out to the sector inviting applications for touring in 2018, based upon our selection criteria.

#### Working with schools

Theatre in Schools Scotland aimed to provide teachers and Local Authorities with a wholeschool experience of theatre with proven reputation, created by companies with an understanding of working in a school environment. The two selected productions covered the whole primary age group, one for lower and one for upper school. Productions were designed specifically with the schools, buildings and audiences in mind, and had a proven record of success in Scottish schools' touring. Each supporting Local Authority made choices about the schools to be involved. Schools were offered one day of each production, one week apart. TiSS arranged all the practicalities with the Head Teacher and companies to ensure minimum disruption to the school.

#### Resources

To enhance the Theatre in Schools Scotland experience, online resources were developed between the partner organisations for teachers to access and use with their class. A pre-show introduction video was created for both the teachers and the pupils to prepare them for the visit. Follow up resources were developed and made accessible online for the teachers to continue to discuss and investigate the themes in the productions.

# Funding

In addition to National Theatre of Scotland, Imaginate and Arts and Business Scotland investment, several funding models were negotiated and developed to deliver the project.

- The Scottish Salmon Company sponsorship funding to enable schools in Comhairle nan Eilean Siar, Highland Council and Argyll and Bute Council to receive double the number of performances and extra activity in these areas. In the Western Isles we were able to cover six primary schools with a minimal amount of funding from the Comhairle nan Eilean Siar
- Local Authority support financial support and working in partnership to identify schools that received Theatre in Schools Scotland
- Partnership work associated managing companies supported the provision in key areas (Horsecross Arts for Perth & Kinross, The Touring Network for The Highland Council and Eilean Siar and NEAT for Aberdeenshire)
- Joint partnership working Festival and King's Theatres Edinburgh and City of Edinburgh Council plus Glasgow Life and Glasgow City Council worked together in financial partnership with schools to increase the capacity and reach across their areas
- Schools booked directly with Theatre in Schools Scotland

# Communications

Theatre in Schools Scotland was successfully launched at Preston Street Primary School, Edinburgh on 1st June 2016, with lead partners, artists and Fiona Hyslop, MSP the Scottish Government Cabinet Secretary for Culture, Tourism and External Affair attending, resulting in positive headlines and widespread news coverage. The Chair of the National Campaign for the Arts alongside actor Samuel West subsequently hailed it as a "wonderful" initiative "that should resonate with the whole of the UK". The project continued to receive positive media coverage throughout Scotland during the tour. Materials were produced to support the tour to enhance the theatre-going experience for children and teachers, including posters which were displayed in every school and a postcard for children to take home, which carried information about the production, resources and website.

# **Future Development**

A robust evaluation process with all participating schools is ongoing in Year One. All findings and feedback will be considered by the producing partners and organisations and will feed into reviewing and developing the project for Year Two.

#### Priorities for Year Two include:

- Continuing to develop bespoke income models and partnerships to enable the work to reach further audiences
- > Piloting an 'in association' production model with our partner organisations
- Strengthening the brand and understanding of Theatre in Schools Scotland with audiences, teachers, local authorities and the theatre and dance sector
- > Investigating ways of capturing the impact on audiences and families
- Continually assessing and developing the strategic priorities to strengthen relationships with theatres/venues and touring networks to ensure Theatre in Schools Scotland will become a respected and sustainable initiative for enhancing the profile, importance and value of work for children in schools
- Continuing to work with the children's theatre and dance sector in Scotland and beyond on how best to develop and sustain Theatre in Schools Scotland
- Establishing our teacher consultation group with whom we will liaise for future planning
- The two main touring shows for 2017 are Up to Speed, produced and created by Rosalind Sydney, and Visible Fictions' Jason and the Argonauts
- > Explore Theatre in School's Scotland strategic engagement within early years settings
