Exploring the forest on your own can be scary but not if you are in the company of Poggle, a friendly creature who is happy to take the lead. With 'Mischief Maker' Poggle by his side Vince is taken on an adventure encouraging him to bravely explore an imaginative changing world around him.

A visually stunning set, reminiscent of children's building blocks, rotates to reveal hidden secrets of the forest. As the story unfolds, children are drawn by the entrancing dance onto the set and into the performance where song and percussion link live sounds and playful movement.






