There are still tickets available throughout the week and next weekend. (See special offer on the back page).

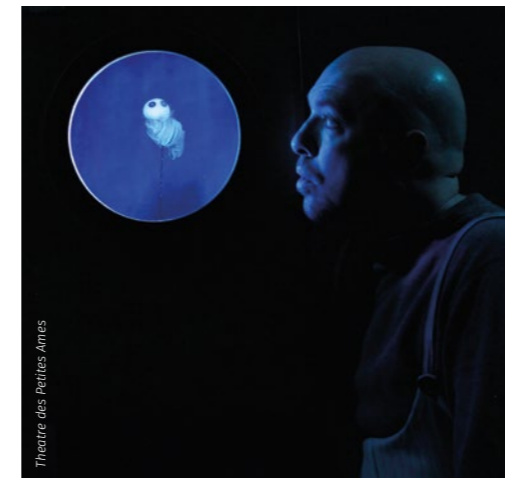

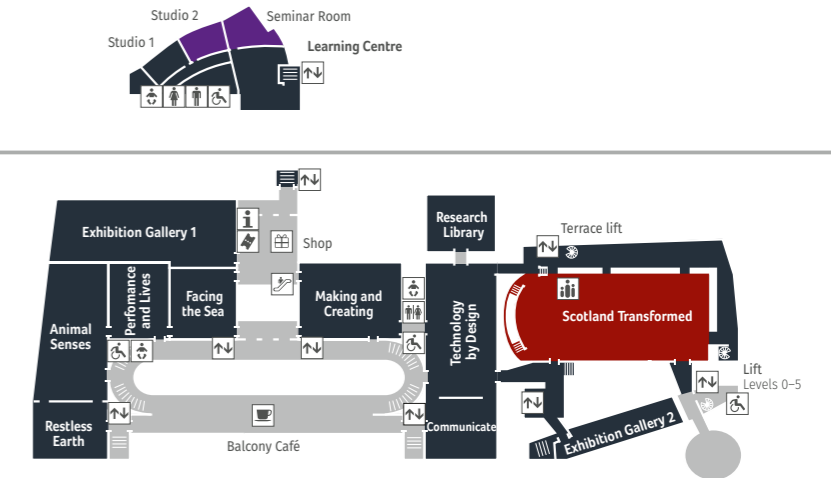
Dybwikdans (Norway)

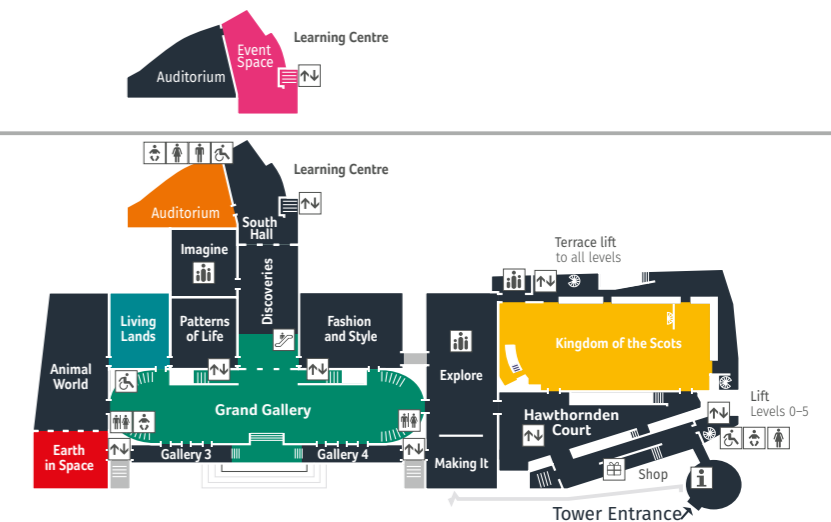
Museum Map
