The Festival will once again take place on Inverleith Park (see map) and will be fully equipped with refreshment facilities. The site is also fully wheelchair accessible.



Richard is a witty and inventive shadow puppeteer. He was chosen by Jim Henson to appear on an international television programme highlighting six of the most creative and exciting puppeteers in the world.

He has travelled widely with his exciting shadow puppet show. This performance includes 'Broken Bridge' – a traditional French story, 'The Cat Came Back' – a traditional song, 'How the Sun Was Made' – an Aboriginal legend, and 'Tale of Two Fishes' – a story of two fish that don't quite see eye to eye. You will also become acquainted with a hero named Super Kangaroo, a hippopotamus that tries to walk the tightrope and many other original and outrageous characters.

Using multi-coloured transparent puppets Richard creates simple and beautifully entertaining stories.
