







A child lies seriously ill in a hospital bed, afraid of the forbidding world all around and unable to sleep. An adult begins to tell the child the story of Hansel and Gretel, two children who also find themselves in a frightening world. As the child's eyes begin to close and the words of the fairy-tale fall around him, two forbidding worlds become one - white walls sprout green trees, doctors and nurses become wood cutters and animals of the forest.

Who will change into the Witch guarding the Gingerbread House? How can the child live happily ever after like Hansel and Gretel?

This production is an innovative piece of music theatre using the rich musical language of Humperdinck's score, while retaining the essence of the Grimm Brothers' story. Puppetry, lighting and a richly coloured soundscape will evoke the mystery and symbolic power of the Black Forest where the tale takes place.




