

Much happens behind the scenes at the Festival. Initiatives and events that you, the Festival's public audience wouldn't necessarily hear about unless we told you!

So, here's our news...

The Festival has a new 'parent company', Imaginate.

Launched by the Minister for Culture, in May last year,

Imaginate develops and promotes performing arts for

children across Scotland.

Imaginate and Bank of Scotland have created an exciting new partnership, title sponsorship of our flag ship event the Scotland International Children's Festival. Bank of Scotland has been a generous and committed supporter of the Festival since it's inception in 1990.

The Festival is still the only event in Britain to present an intensive programme of international theatre for children. This year's event has more international theatre companies than ever before with seven companies coming to Edinburgh from Germany, Denmark, Italy and USA.

The Festival distributes school's programmes to every school in Scotland. As a result over 8,000 tickets have been sold to 100 schools from the Hebrides to the Borders and Dumfrieshire to East Lothian for the 2001 Festival.

Each year Imaginate raises funds to help schools pay for their travel costs to the Festival. In 2000 Imaginate assisted 6.500 visits. During Festival week, a further 1,000 children at 10 schools will participate in the Festival's Outreach programme when Imaginate takes 2 companies into schools who do not have the resources to visit the Festival in theatres.

After the Festival Imaginate will tour German company Theater Triebwerk's award-winning show Moby Dick to Stirling, Glasgow, Arbroath, Invergordon, Inverness and Kilmarnock.

In between Festivals Imaginate produces a showcase of Scottish children's theatre - WYSIWYG (What You See Is What You Get). Hosted by a Scottish theatre venue each year, this unique event is for people who make and promote theatre to see shows, share ideas and create new partnerships.

And finally, you'll probably notice a lot of Danish shows and visitors at this years Festival. That's because Imaginate has organised a Cultural Skills Exchange Programme to enable Scottish and Danish makers of children's theatre to learn from each other.
