Welcome to the 2020 Edinburgh International Children's Festival featuring 15 production across a variety of genres including music, spoken word text, puppetry, dance, acrobatics and musical theatre. You may notice a few changes this year, made in response to audience feedback on their experience of attending previous editions of the Festival.

A longer Festival – In order to accommodate increased demand from schools, we have extended the dates of the Festival, which will start a few days earlier than usual. This is in line with our mission to allow more children from all backgrounds to access more high quality theatre. This change will not affect the normal delegate programme, which remains from Monday 25 to Saturday 30 May. **More networking opportunities** – We are trialling a range of new events to enable delegates to interact more with each other across the week. This will be particularly useful for those attending our Festival for the first time. I encourage you to delve in and see which of our new delegate events appeal to you.

You will also notice that we work with venues across the city. We are committed to breaking down barriers to bring as many children as possible to our Festival, and staging productions in areas of multiple deprivation is key to that. The venues selected provide a good geographical spread and help us reach a wide range of children and young people in Edinburgh. More information on how to get to each venue by bus is provided on p.31.

I hope you join us and over 300 delegates from all over the world for what promises to be an exciting Festival.

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ABOUT IMAGINATE





Imaginate is Scotland's national organisation which promotes, develops and celebrates professional theatre and dance for children and young people (ages 0-15). We believe that all children have the right to experience inspiring theatre and dance regardless of their background, circumstances, access needs or location. Our work falls into three strands.

- The Edinburgh International Children's Festival: an annual celebration of the world's best theatre and dance for young audiences, attracting over 15,000 people each year.
- ★ A year-round schools programme, to develop children and teachers' creativity through watching, talking about and making art based around performances. This includes Theatre in Schools Scotland, a national touring programme of theatre and dance for schools, in partnership with the National Theatre of Scotland.
- A Creative Development programme to support and encourage artists to make high-quality performances for children including residencies, mentoring, workshops and networking events.

Encouraged by unpredictable improvisations on the double bass and the quirky bird-like movements of the performers, *Sparrow* allows for both individual and collective interaction between those present. The piece is first and foremost a celebration of play and social interaction in an atmosphere of light, dance and music.



THROWN Xana Marwick

Out of their pocket they pull a creased and crumpled piece of paper. Big Bryan's Boxing Gym, it says. 8pm. It's 7.45pm now. If they run, they'll make it. No one will notice that they've gone...'

Xana Marwick is a writer and director based in Edinburgh, working across theatre and television. Her work is often for/ inspired by children and young people. particularly those she has met through her experience in socially excluded communities. UNTITLED DISCOTHEQUE PROJECT Shotput

Untitled Discotheque Project is a fun, semi-immersive show about the intersection between teenagers, technology and sex. It physicalises how teens navigate relationships in the age of TikTok, Snapchat and Instagram. The Discotheque Project is not a cautionary tale. It's not a documentary. Nor is it an education. This is a show about feelings not morals. An ensemble of dancers, a DJ and an immersive design combine to make a raucous teenage disco where all is welcome: the good, the bad and the twisted. **Shotput** is a dance-theatre company founded by Lucy Ireland and Jim Manganello in Glasgow in 2018. The company makes work about the darker corners of contemporary experience with athleticism, humour and a healthy sense of the absurd. Shotput combines dance, theatre and film, seeking to give audiences an experience that is both kinetic and connected to the big themes of today. At the centre of the work is a fascination with human relationships—sensual, illogical, uncontrollable—and a provocation to the audience to map their own narrative onto the physical/visual material on stage.

CARNIVAL ODYSSEY Project X

Carnival is a time when you can be anyone – from a mighty warrior to a mythical butterfly, or even a cunning trickster! Travelling across time and lands far and wide, this tale of Carnival is a celebration of Caribbean heritage and identity asking who we are, what is our history and how we move through the world.

With Broomes' signature direction of striking audio and visuals playing with the extremities of physicality, and with Harris' artistic practice in sculpture, masquerades and carnival traditions, *Carnival Odyssey* is a new dance work that features remixed soundscapes and sculptural costumes. **Project X** Project X is a collectively run organisation. They specialise in dance and performance and platform art forms of the African and Caribbean diaspora. Their artistic vision is delivered through 4 strands – Xchange, Community, Conversation and Platform. They support artists who identify as Black and/+ POC at different stages of their careers. They deliver workshops to all ages, and create performance platforms. Project X is a collaboration celebrating the crosspollination of identities, ideas and forms.

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


