## **WELCOME BACK**



It's been a while since we were last able to present the Edinburgh International Children's Festival. In 2019 we celebrated our 30th anniversary and the world looked bright. None of us were able to gaze into a crystal ball and predict what would occur in 2020.

For 2021, we have made a commitment that we would not be cancelling our festival as we had to do last year. We have had to plan (and re-plan) events that can adapt to changing restrictions, so that no matter what, we can bring much needed art, culture and entertainment to children and

young people. However, while things are looking up, continued restrictions on live performances means that the only safe and sure approach has been to only programme digital performances for our 2021 schools programme. This has resulted in a smaller festival offer, but one that can be accessed anywhere in Scotland.

Whilst this Festival programme might look and feel slightly different, it is no less bold. We proudly place Scottish and UK artists at the centre of the Festival and have included innovative 'live' digital interaction within the performance offer.

I ask you to come along on the journey and experience what theatrical magic our artists have to offer.

Rich with wonderfully imaginative storytelling and creative play, *Potato Needs a Bath* offers a unique introduction to the world of fruit and vegetables whilst offering an exciting new stimulus for a range of creative activities in the classroom. This production can support work in Health & Wellbeing, Literacy and Expressive Arts. Links could also be made to food journeys, supporting work in Social Studies.

Potato has mud on his face. Potato has mud in his ears. Potato needs a bath (just don't get soap in his eyes!)

There is going to be a party, and everyone is ready – except for Potato. Onion is practising his guitar, Aubergine is wearing her new necklace and Peach is bouncing on the bed with excitement.

The problem is Potato needs a bath – but he has other ideas – because Potato loves mud!

Meet Maris Piper and her fruit and vegetable friends in this colourful combination of live and pre-recorded performance based on the much loved theatre show, then join the fruit and vegetable party of the year live on Teams.

Potato Needs a Bath (digital) is based on the original theatre show by Andy Manley & Shona Reppe and was commissioned by Theatre in Schools Scotland, a National Theatre of Scotland and Imaginate partnership.

Pupils are encouraged to bring a fruit or vegetable friend to the party. We will send you instruction videos in advance with suggestions of what to make to get ready for the vegetable party.

# **MIXED UP**

#### KATY WILSON, CO-COMMISSIONED AND PRODUCED BY IMAGINATE AND STARCATCHERS

Level: Nursery - P4

**Capacity:** Unlimited – The first 100 schools who book for *Mixed Up* will receive a small pack of art materials including chalks and confetti, to be used in school as part of the show's interactive outdoor experience.

#### **How To Watch:**

Mixed Up will be delivered as a series of activities over two 45 minute sessions and will consist of short films, creative workshops recorded by the artists and guided teacher-led activities.

**Session 1:** A 10 min film and a 30 min teacher-led movement and drawing-based playground activity

**Session 2:** Three short films and related teacher-led art activity and a discussion session on emotions

Mixed Up is a vibrant, interactive playground experience exploring our feelings and emotions through painting, music, and dance.

Central to the experience will be a short film to enjoy together as a class. The film is an energetic, colourful, and creative expression of hip-hop dance and street art, filmed outside in Edinburgh. Then it's time to get creative! Head for your playground for a teacher-facilitated large-scale drawing, supported by a range of materials, as part of the *Mixed Up* experience. The package also includes short videos and an inclassroom creative task to help children explore their feelings.

We've all been through a turbulent time – with separations, restrictions and loss. Our emotions are all mixed up and hard to express through words. This is a unique opportunity for young children to see how big feelings can safely be explored in a physical way.

This interactive performance explores feelings and emotions in turbulent times. Colourful and positive, *Mixed Up* provides a unique platform for young children to see how big feelings can safely be explored in a physical way, supporting work within **Health & Wellbeing** and **Expressive Arts**.

Roadshow hosts Rob and Sal are coming to the end of their schools tour, but are running late for the day's gig. The audience is already waiting impatiently when they enter the stage, struggling with their touring kit. Opening with a cheery (some might say cheesy!) ditty, they launch into their show. Things are going pretty well, as Rob and Sal teach us what it's like for disabled people in today's world ... until the younger generation decides to set them straight!

Created by Robert Softley Gale, artistic director of Birds of Paradise Theatre and writer of the multi-award-winning My Left/Right Foot, this show exemplifies the company's vision of a culture where disabled artists are recognised for the excellence of their work and celebrated for the stories they bring to the stage.

#### **Curriculum for Excellence:**

Drawn from the lived experiences of young people in the care system this show presents a hard-hitting story with heart, humour and humanity. This production is a perfect route into work around rights, responsibility and awareness, supporting learning in Health and Wellbeing and Social Studies.

Removed is a moving and shocking insight into the experiences of Adam, a young man sharing his story of living within the state care system.

"Adam is OK to share his story; really it's all right. It's OK that his life was turned upside down...and the social workers were nice, kinda.... and the foster homes, well... and his baby brother Joe??"

Sometimes heart-breaking, sometimes hilarious, Adam's story reaches out and grabs you, pulling you into a world that you might think you know. While Adam's story is fictional, it is an amalgam of the many stories of young people with experience of the care system, interviewed over three years across Northern Ireland. Although dealing at times with a dark subject matter, *Removed* is an ideal fit for young people.

The text has been beautifully shot as a direct to camera monologue rather than a filmed performance of the stage production – the result powerfully brings Adam's story intimately alive for the viewer

This interactive, mutli sensory production explores the vital role of the Land Army during World War II. Rich with opportunities to explore the natural world and agriculture within an historical context, *Down to Earth* can support work around Health and Wellbeing, Social Studies and Science

Using Bamboozle's own immersive style, *Down to Earth: Outdoors* is an interactive, multi-sensory production inspired by the Land Army girls of World War II. Individually welcomed into the production through song, children will touch and feel a vegetable patch full of earth and fresh produce, meet a mischievous mole and enjoy a night time forest journey with fireflies to help light the way.

A rare and moving experience, Down to Earth was first presented at our 2016 Festival and incorporates live music, movement and most powerfully, stillness, to ensure each participant has the time to respond to this gentle performance in their own way. During the COVID panademic the production has been re-staged as an outdoor performance to ensure the safety of its audience members. This new version enhances the magical quality of the production which celebrates each child's closeness with nature.
